

# How to Add Remote Issue Link on GitHub

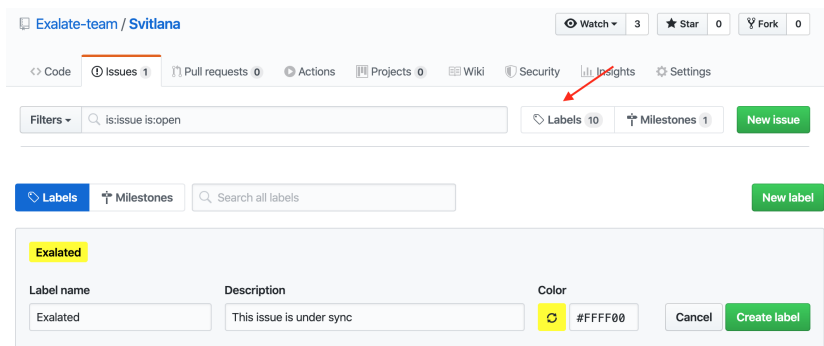
This article shows how to add a link of the remote issue to a GitHub issue.

The Exalate app does not provide a sync panel on a GitHub issue. You can [check the status of the synced issue](#) in the Exalate admin dashboard.

If you need to add the remote issue link to an issue on the GitHub side, you can add it as a comment using the Groovy-based scripting.

1. Create a label **Exalated** in the repository where you sync issues

You can find a list of labels under your repository name -> Issues/Pull requests -> Labels



2. Add the script into the Incoming sync

## Incoming sync (GitHub)

Add a comment with a link to a remote issue and set the label **Exalated**

```
if (issue.labels.findAll{it.label == "Exalated"}.size() == 0) {  
  
    issue.comments = commentHelper.addComment("Remote key is ${issueUrl} ", issue.comments)  
    def newLabel = nodeHelper.getLabel("Exalated")  
  
    issue.labels += newLabel  
}
```

If this comment needs to be set automatically whenever the issue has been created - add to the Incoming sync on the remote side
